



TEXAS BLUEBONNETS

(Lupinus texensis)

Establishing Bluebonnets

- Plant bluebonnets in the fall; late September through early November.
- For best results, rake the ground or cover seeds with 1/2 inch soil to ensure good seed-soil contact. The seeds can be hand broadcast and compacted into the soil.
- Plant in a well-drained site with plenty of sun.
- Unscarified seed, in a natural setting, will produce plants over a longer period of time than scarified seed.
- Recommended planting rate is 1 lb per 1,000 square feet or 15 pounds per acre.
- Water if the weather is dry.
- Bluebonnets bloom in the spring, March through May.
- Bluebonnets will reseed and bloom again subsequent years. Do not mow until the plants have blossomed and produced seed pods which have dried and opened.

Suggested Planting Rate:
15 Lbs per Acre for a native look
Or 1 lb per 1,000 ft² for flower beds
